TEXT: LOS ANGELES - Leaders of the Eagles, one of the most popular bands of the 1970s, have apparently settled their long-standing and much-publicized differences and will reunite.

Sources close to the band said the group's core members and songwriters, Don Henley and Glenn Frey, agreed to put aside the decade-old feud that was said to be the key impediment to any reunion.

They will reportedly re-form the band to record an album in the spring after Henley returns from Japan where he is touring in support of his The End of Innocence album. A tour would likely be part of the reunion. Frey joined Henley onstage in Los Angeles this winter.

It is not clear which other band members would reunite with Frey and Henley, and details won't be settled until Henley returns.
